Trevor Short, M.D., started working at PrimeCare of Southeastern Ohio in high school in medical records and returned in summer 2017 – this time practicing internal medicine. "The opportunity to come back and work as a physician now is exciting to me," Dr. Short said.

Internal medicine includes disease diagnosis, prevention and management in adults. Dr. Tran treats a wide variety of cancers, with special interests in treating lung, colon and pancreatic cancers. He also treats benign and malignant blood diseases. "The incidences of cancer have been rising," Dr. Tran said. Multiple causes can explain this trend, which include aging, pollution, smoking, diet, inactivity and infection. However, lifestyle modifications such as smoking cessation, exercise, healthy diet and weight loss could reduce cancer development by one third, he noted.

Dr. Tran earned his doctor of medicine at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. He completed his internal medicine residency at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center in McKeesport, Pennsylvania, and his hematology/oncology fellowship at the University of California Irvine Medical Center in California.

SURVIVING THE WIDOW MAKER

Excellent Heart Care Saves Woman's Life

It felt like indigestion, and she blamed a milkshake. The discomfort faded away and then returned with a vengeance. She also felt extremely tired, but chalked that up to being so busy. After a few days, Penny Higgins, 70, requested an appointment with her primary care physician. She described her symptoms to a nurse, who instructed her to go directly to the hospital because the symptoms matched those of a heart attack. "I didn't think it could be a heart attack – I didn't feel that bad," Penny remembers. "It wasn't like a heart attack in a movie scene."

Heart attacks in women often look and feel much less dramatic than the stereotypical elephant-on-the-chest scenario. Symptoms can include shortness of breath, light-headedness, cold sweats, nausea and neck, jaw or back pain.

Penny Higgins is able to exercise again after suffering a heart attack and is grateful to the Heart & Vascular team at Genesis for saving her life.

Penny didn't go directly to the hospital. She pressed on. That evening, at a board meeting for a local school foundation, ne symptoms surfaced. Pressure tightened around her chest like rubber bands pulling, a stinging sensation shot down her arr and her stomach pain caused vomiting. Yet she stubbornly drove herself home to get her husband before heading to th Genesis Emergency Department (ED).

Minutes Matter

Within minutes of arriving at the ED, Penny realized just how serious the situation was. "Nine or ten people gathered arou and began working with extreme efficiency. They told me I indeed having a heart attack, and they had to work fast to sa my life," Penny said.

The ED and interventional cardiology teams collaborated at speed. Penny had a complete blockage at the beginning of h main artery down the front of the heart. As far as heart atta go, this is a biggie – often referred to as the widow maker.

"When it comes to heart attacks, every minute counts, and time is heart muscle," said Abdulhay Albirini, M.D., interventional cardiologist with the Genesis Heart, Lung & Vascular Group. "Literally, every minute a blockage in an arte stops blood flow, more of the heart muscle dies. When care delayed, significant permanent damage can result. On the ot hand, if we can open the artery right away, heart muscle damage can be minimal and the majority of patients go on to live normal lives."

Life-saving Procedure

Dr. Albirini and his team rushed Penny into the Cardiac Catheterization Lab for diagnosis and treatment. Through a tiny, two millimeter catheter, Dr. Albirini maneuvered a hair-t wire through the clot and inflated a balloon to bust the blockage. Then he deployed a small, wire mesh stent to hold the artery permanently open. "They saved my life," Penny sai "I hope at least one person learns from my story. Don't be foolish like I was; get to the hospital right away."

"In the old days, before Genesis had a heart program doing these procedures, patients were transferred to Columbus – 60 miles from here – which delayed treatment," recalls Dr. Albirini. "Now, our communities have access to outstanding care close to home – it makes a big difference in outcomes."
full Ier Icks	In fact, Genesis Hospital provides superior heart and vascular care compared to the majority of the heart centers around the nation, according to national quality indicators collected by the American College of Cardiology. "We are successful because we have the expertise and the technology, and we work so well together. The ED team, the cardiologists, the technicians and nurses – everyone knows their role and treats the patient promptly," Dr. Albirini said.
ery is ther	Penny agrees and noted that even rehabilitation from her heart attack began soon after. "I was still in the hospital, and it was 12 or 14 hours after the procedure that they began talking with me about how to improve and sustain my life," Penny said.
thin	Learning to Make Changes Penny takes her recovery and lifestyle changes seriously. In addition to improving her diet, Penny participated in Heart & Vascular Rehabilitation three times a week for three months. Combining exercise, education and support, the rehabilitation program strengthens individuals and solidifies lifestyle changes
l id.	"Genesis' rehabilitation program is wonderful," Penny said. "We talked with pharmacists, had support groups and learned from nutritionists. I've built my strength by using the exercise machines too. Plus, I'm lucky because I have my husband. We've been married 51 years, and his support helps me get through this."
	Next up for Penny? She's slowing down her lifestyle, eating out less and cooking more low-salt, low-fat foods. She has returned to water aerobics and will continue serving West Muskingum Schools, First Christian Church and the Salvation Army Women's Auxiliary.

Better Than National Standards



quickly, beating national standards example, from October 2016 to September 2017, 97 percent of Genesis heart attack patients received potentially lifesaving percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI) within 59 minutes of arriving at the hospital when the national standard is 90 minutes. PCI is a non-surgical method to open narrowed arteries that supplies the heart with blood

REDUCING PRESCRIBED OPIATES

Robert Reicher was glad he could use a pain pump following shoulder surgery and avoid taking pain medications.

Young Patient Prefers Pain Pump

When a way to reduce opioid pain medication following surgery is available, both doctors and patients take notice. Robert Reicher, a college freshman, was excited to learn he could have surgery without taking opiod pain medication. The 19-year-old is a thrower on a college track team who was facing shoulder surgery.

The day of surgery, Howard Robinson, M.D., anesthesiologist, Zanesville Anesthesia Physicians, gave Robert the option of pain medication or using the ON-Q pain pump, a non-narcotic alternative for pain relief after surgery. Robert had been through a couple surgeries before so he chose the pain pump because of the zero risk of becoming addicted and not having the side effect of drowsiness he experienced with pain medication for other surgeries. "Having shoulder surgery was definitely easier than having my appendix or wisdom teeth out. This time, I felt normal while I was recovering."

Patient in Control

Before surgery, an anesthesiologist places a small tube near the nerves of the surgical site. Following surgery, a small pump, about the size of a tennis ball, clips to the patient's clothing or is carried in a small carrying case. "The pump releases medication every minute and provides exceptional pain relief avoiding opioid use altogether," said Dr. Robinson. "The pain pump is clinically proven to manage post-operative pain better than narcotics alone with fewer side effects." Narcotics are typically prescribed to help manage pain after surgery, but the side effects can make patients feel dizzy, drowsy, constipated or nauseated.

Faster Recovery, Less Pain

Samuel Finck, D.O., Genesis orthopedic surgeon, performed Robert's arthroscopic labral repair. Dr. Finck finds the pain pump works on any age patient and many types of surgeries. "Pain management is a critical element of recovery for all of our surgical patients. Many patients are unaware of alternatives to narcotics for postoperative pain management," he said. "The ON-Q pain pump enables our clinicians to reduce the reliance on narcotics for treating surgical pain while helping our patients recover faster, with less pain," he said. The pain pump is an alternative to opioid pain medication for surgeries including orthopedic, cardiovascular/cardiothoracic, OB/GYN and general surgery.

Robert was enthused about the pain pump and the outcome. "If ON-Q is an option, I will never take pain meds again. It didn't make me drowsy, I took the tube out myself and not once did I take any other medicine for pain." The pump empties in two to five days, depending on the surgery, and the tube is removed and thrown away by the patient. Because the pain pump is used one time, infections are rare.

Genesis is helping reduce opiate use and the addiction epidemic Ohio faces and is the only hospital in the area using a pain pump to replace opiates following surgery. If you have surgery scheduled, ask if the pain pump can be used for your type of surgery.

FROM BROKEN AND BUSTED TO WHOLE AND HEALING

Herb Ater appreciates being able to spend time with his family after being severely injured in a car crash. The Genesis orthopedic surgeons specializing in trauma provided expert care, enabling Herb to get back to work and enjoy his family. Pictured left to right are cousin Collin Jackson, Herb, Shannon and Tresta Ater and kneeling Tre Ater. On a regular morning during his routine drive to work toward Zanesville, the horrific happened. In this life-altering, life-threatening moment, an oncoming vehicle veered out of its lane and pounded into the driver's door where Herb Ater, 39, of McConnelsville, was sitting.

Herb doesn't remember the emergency services team cutting through the roof of his vehicle to reach him. He doesn't remember the Genesis Community Ambulance trip or being whisked into trauma surgery at Genesis. But he does remember waking up the next day in Genesis Hospital. "They said I was very lucky to live through this," Herb said. "It was just a normal day, but it could have been my last day."

Dr. Tucker and physicians on the team provided the post-operative and follow-up care for Herb. Yet with an ever-positive outlook, Herb sings praises of the Genesis teams that collaborated to save him and provide his broken, busted body with the best care possible.

Immediate Care for **Traumatic Injuries**

During the eight-hour surgery, one of Genesis' orthopedic trauma surgeons, Ian Alexander, M.D., repaired Herb's left femur by placing a metal rod through the middle of the bone. He also used a metal plate and 13 screws to hold together Herb's arm. Then, Dr. Alexander set and cast Herb's right leg and ankle. "The surgery went very well, and we were able to get to his injuries right away," said Dr. Alexander. "Timeliness of care is a big issue. When we get a call from the Emergency Department that a trauma patient is on the way, we can be at the patient's bedside in a timely fashion and provide surgery as soon as medically possible after the patient arrives at the hospital. It's a real advantage of Genesis' dedicated trauma team and their expertise."

In Konarden MD

To ensure such timeliness, a board-certified orthopedic surgeon with a specialty in trauma remains on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week at Genesis Hospital. Each of these orthopedic trauma surgeons has expertise in acute care/trauma and has extensive experience before joining the Genesis team. "Knowing that we are a well-vetted, highly-trained, seasoned orthopedic team, dedicated to providing the optimal care for the area's patients, brings our patients comfort," said Amy Tucker, M.D., orthopedic surgeon specializing in trauma at Genesis. "We follow best practices in the management of orthopedic injuries, and our response time is excellent."

Skilled Physicians

"The whole group of doctors was awesome," Herb said. "They explained everything in detail, kept us up-to-date, answered our questions and helped my wife, mom and sister all feel comfortable. I was in safe hands, and they did an amazing job."

Throughout the healing process, Herb said his focus has been on his loved ones. As father to a 16-year-old son and 12-year-old daughter, and husband to his wife Shannon, Herb says the accident strengthened and renewed their family bonds.

"It has helped me appreciate the little things, because you might not be here tomorrow," Herb said. "I spend a lot of time with my children. We are a close family, and we have a great time together." His wife, Shannon, noted how the traumatic event greatly impacted each person in the family - and proved that they can come together during the storms of life.

"You definitely realize how quickly things can change. I wouldn't know what to do without him," Shannon said. "You realize how much someone means to you. It's so important to be together, and family really comes together in tough times. We're so thankful to Genesis for being there when he desperately needed help."
